Carers Rights Day 2024 is about raising awareness of Carers' rights and entitlements, to help Carers get the support they need.

Welcome to our new look newsletter! We are thrilled to share with you the latest developments in our local community and to let you know what's taking place at Enfield Carers Centre.

Inside this edition you'll see news about this year's Carers Rights Day event (see page 7) which we always combine with our Annual General Meeting. This year's theme has yet to be announced by Carers UK but will focus on your rights today, tomorrow and in the future.

You may already have heard that Carers' Leave has now become law on 6 April 2024. The regulations for the Carer's Leave Act 2023 make clear that employees in Great Britain with a long-term unpaid caring responsibility for a family member or friend will be able to take up to five days of unpaid Carer's Leave. They will have the same employment protections associated with other forms of family-related leave, such as protection from dismissal as a result of having taken the leave.

With the introduction of the new Employment Relations (Flexible Working) Act, anyone will be able to ask their employer for changes to their working hours, times of work, or place of work, from day one. And being able to ask for a different flexible working arrangement more than once a year will be a huge help for Carers.

Make sure your GP knows you are caring for someone so that you can be offered a free Flu Jab this year.

The 2024 to 2025 "Flu Season" vaccination this Autumn will be offered in two cohorts:From 1st September:-

- all children aged 2 or 3 years on 31 August 2024
- all primary school aged children (from reception to year 6)
- secondary school-aged children (years 7, 8, 9, 10 and 11)
- those aged 6 months to under 18 years in clinical risk groups (as defined in the <u>Green Book</u>, <u>Chapter 19 (Influenza)</u>)
- pregnant women

And then from 3rd October:-

- those aged 65 years and over (including those who are 64 but will be 65 on or before 31 March 2025)
- those aged 18 years to under 65 years in clinical risk groups (as defined in the <u>Green Book</u>, <u>Chapter 19 (Influenza)</u>)
- those in long-stay residential care homes and other long-stay care facilities where rapid

- spread is likely to follow introduction of infection and increase the likelihood of death
- Carers in receipt of Carer's
 Allowance, or those who are the main carer of an elderly or disabled person
- close contacts of immunocompromised individuals
- frontline workers in a social care setting without employer led occupational health schemes including those working for:
 - a registered residential care or nursing home
 - registered domiciliary care providers
 - voluntary managed hospice providers
 - those that are employed by those who receive direct payments (personal budgets) or Personal Health Budgets, such as Personal Assistants



News about this Autumn's Coronavirus vaccination programme

The Joint Committee on Vaccination and Immunisation [the JCVI] published its latest advice to the UK government stating that Covid 19 vaccinations no longer offer effective protection against infection, but they do protect against infections becoming serious and leading to hospital admission.

There are a number of reasons for this, but mainly the virus has "drifted" from its original configuration in the last few years.

So, for Autumn 2024, JCVI advises that a COVID-19 vaccine should be offered only to:

- adults aged 65 years and over
- residents in a care home for older adults
- persons aged 6 months to 64 years in a clinical risk group

At the time of writing, Carers have not been approved to receive the Autumn vaccine.

You may have noticed that there are a lot of coughs and colds about (perhaps understandably, as many people have stopped handwashing, using alcohol gels and are not as good at using tissues etc.) The Respiratory Syncytial Virus [RSV] which used to only affect children badly, but for whom there was a vaccination, now affects a growing number of older adults who are sometimes taken to hospital.

There's going to be a new RSV vaccination programme - initially restricted to: All adults turning 75 on or after 1/9/24 and then a catchup campaign for those aged 75 to 79 years old.

Enfield Carers Centre Counselling Service

You don't have to struggle alone, or in silence. Our Counsellors are here for you to talk to.

Making the decision to start counselling and addressing the issues you are facing is an important first step and should be commended.

Counselling is one type of talking therapy that allows a person to talk about their problems and feelings in a confidential and non-judgmental environment.

Our counsellors are trained to listen with empathy to help you explore your thoughts and feelings; the counselling process aims to help you deal with and overcome issues that are causing emotional pain or making you feel uncomfortable.

Carers' Employment Workshop Tuesday 1st Oct 2024 11am to 1pm

Applying for a job can be daunting, no matter how much experience you have and what job you are applying for, this can be even harder for Carers, who need to be able to communicate the transferable skills they use whilst caring, and may have gaps in their work history.

You may need help preparing once you find a job you're interested in.

Our Carers' Employment Workshop aims to help Carers gain skills, knowledge and confidence to understand what employers look for when reviewing CVs and during interviews. Counselling provides a safe and nonjudgmental space for you to talk and explore difficult situations and feelings.

ECC counselling sessions are very reasonably priced at £10 per session with discounts available for block bookings and with comparably short waiting times.

In comparison, standard fees for private counselling sessions are upwards of £50 - £70 per session often with long waiting times.





Thanks to all who completed our 2023-24 Carers Satisfaction Survey

This year we received a record number of 694 responses to our annual survey. We really appreciate you taking the time to let us know what you think about our services and how they affect you.

Below is a snapshot of the survey results. More information will be published in our Annual Impact Report which is published at our AGM each year. (see page 7)

93% of Carers said they felt better able to cope with their caring role with support from Enfield Carers Centre

90% of Carers said that using Enfield Carers Centre services had improved their quality of life

85% of Carers are satisfied or very satisfied with the quality of Enfield Carers Centre services

83% of Carers agreed that our staff understood their needs

81% of Carers felt less isolated since attending social and leisure activities organised by Enfield Carers Centre

Just under **90%** of Carers who received help from our Benefits Advisor said their finances had improved

Enfield Carers Centre is funded by living in or looking after someone who lives in Enfield. We are also part of Carers Trust: the largest UK network of Carer organisations.
